We actually had two programs for the day. Key Club officers Samantha Chang, President and Vice-President Tiffany Hsieh told of their great work re-establishing Key Club as a force in our community. Some of the projects completed were hospital pots, stuffed animals, and they were successful in their application for the Most Improved Club. Projects they are working on include Senior Citizen Prom, and beach cleanup, Ithop pancake day breakfast on March 12, and a Firecracker Run promoting health and fitness. I apologize for not knowing all the details but they have won a grant for \$1,300 from Kiwanis International. It is good to hear the accomplishments of our renewed Key Club.

The second presentation was by the Temple City Youth Committee members Kristy He and Justin Chai. This is a very active and pro-active committee with mentoring by City Clerk Peggy Kuo and Deputy City Clerk Jillian Nunez. This committee was formed 8 years ago at the instigation and mentoring of Councilmember Tom Chavez. Members are chosen from Temple City Schools, grades 6-12. They serve for two years and originally started in 2011 with 5 members. In 2015 they increased to 11 members. They meet in the Council Chambers on the 4th Thursday of the month at 5:30 p.m.. The meetings are open to the public and they get to sit in the "Big Chairs".

Some of their accomplishments include Water Conservation and Preservation, Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety, the Little Free Library and book donation, Public Transportation, and the Hosting of Quality of Life Pop Up Discussions. Their latest big achievement was doing a traffic study to improve safety on Lemon Ave. at the High School. The Council approved their recommendations and improvements will begin soon.
