Jason Farned is the Operations Manager for the San Gabriel Valley Mosquito & Vector Control District. Jason began his career in public service at the San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District in 2013 as a Vector Control Specialist. He served as the District's Public Information Officer from 2014 to 2017 where he managed District communications, education, and public outreach. He currently serves as the Operations Manager where he oversees field operations, facility, equipment, and fleet management.

What is a Vector-Borne Disease? A "vector-borne disease" is an infectious agent such as a virus, bacteria or parasite that is passed from a disease carrier (vector) to another organism. Only female mosquitos bite. West Nile virus is a Flavivirus spread by certain species of mosquitoes. It is the most predominant mosquito borne disease in California, and is endemic in the state, which means it's always present in the environment as it cycles between mosquitoes and a wide variety of bird species. Humans and other animals like horses are also susceptible but do not contribute to the disease cycle.

Zika is spread mostly by the bite of the invasive Aedes species mosquitoes. These mosquitoes bite primarily during the day, indoors and outdoors. Zika can be in your body for months. This means, men, women and children are susceptible. In some cases, Zika can be passed from a pregnant woman to her fetus. Infection during pregnancy can cause certain birth defects. There is no vaccine or medicine for Zika.
