Ed Chen did a great job standing in for Christian Warner, head of government services for Athens Services. Ed has a home-grown Temple Citizen in his 8th year at Athens.

Athens Services is a family owned business since 1957. They are owned by the Arakelian family with 4 generations. They are the largest hauler in LA and Orange Counties with six operation facilities including a composting plant in Victorville.

Athens employs over 1,200 people with half of their drivers having been with them over 10 years. By the year 2050 there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish. Despite all the years of effort only 14% of plastic is being recycled. Recycling is really sorting.

Temple City is state-mandated to have at least 50% of its waste recycled. Temple City is at 70% avoiding hefty fines of \$10,000 per day for non-compliance (paid by Athens). There are 17 composting facilities in California. Athens has their facility in Victorville where green and food waste is transported by truck to be processed. Athens compost is much sought after as it is organic and full of nutrients for your plants.

Temple City is one of four cities picking up trash the old fashioned way twice a week without automated trucks. The other cities are South El Monte, Glendora, and Azusa. These trucks cost \$500,000 each.

After you collect your cans, bottles and paper, then put them out by the curb, do you ever think about where everything goes after the truck picks things up? Largely, it goes to China. Every day, nearly 4,000 shipping containers full of recyclables leave US ports bound for China. China sends the US toys, clothes and electronics; in return, some of America's largest exports back are paper, plastic and aluminum.

But that equation is changing as of Jan. 1 — China is enforcing its new "National Sword" policy, which bans 24 types of solid waste, including various plastics and unsorted mixed papers, and sets a much tougher standard for contamination levels. China notified the World Trade Organization about the ban in July, essentially saying the country would no longer act as the world's trash dump. Currently, China consumes 55 percent of the world's scrap paper and is a major destination for other recyclables.
