Miss Temple City Patricia Peng will bring some royalty to us. Accompanying her are Princesses Sarah Chavez and Janessa Larsuel. They will tell of their experience so far and how it has changed their life.

LAST TUESDAY

Mayor Nanette Fish was our featured speaker for the day. Nan had served as a Parks & Recreation Commissioner for many years beginning in 2005. She took over as Camellia Festival Director in 2008 upon the retirement of Marie Corrigan. She was elected to the City Council in 2015. Nan is blessed to have two children, Cameron and Lannie.

Nan was named as the 2015 Honorary Grand Marshal of the Camellia Festival. Just some of her accomplishments include a "White Suiter" for the Tournament of Roses, founding member of Temple City Relay for Life, PTA Executive Boards, TC Youth Football, Ramrodders, TC American Little League, Advanced CERT member, TCUSD Volunteer Awards, Congressman Adam Shiff selected Nan as Woman of the Year.

Nan began her talk thanking our club for the service we provide. Her main concern has been communications. There have been many rumors circulating, and all she is asking is to speak to a City Council member for the real story. Our city just adopted the 2019-2020 budget. Revenues are essentially flat with minor growth. Just some of the things that our dedicated City Council have to deal with are increases of Sheriff services and Animal Control, and pension cost. The Council is also concerned that they do not have sustainable funding sources to address the infrastructure needs. The Council is exploring a possible parcel tax to address these critical needs.

The Chamber of Commerce will be moving into office space at City Hall. Some of the big money items include Public Safety and Parks & Recreation (The fun department). Temple City takes Public Safety very seriously under the direct supervision of 15-year Supervisor Bryan Ariizumi. The second big-money item is our Sheriff's Department. We have a dedicated team of Sergeant Ron Miranda, deputies Jose Zuniga, Van Lam, and Greg Chico. We are fortunate to have a pro-active Captain Dave Flores in charge.

Just some of the milestones achieved are if trends continue the City will see a second year in a row of decreasing Part 1 (serious crimes). Residential Burglaries are also down for the second year at 13.95%, Commercial Burglaries are down 57.19%, Petty Theft down 55%, All Part 1 crimes down by 23%. Temple City has invested a total of \$40,000 to help subsidize the Ring doorbell to residents. Personally, I am glad that we are a Contract City for law enforcement. There are 23 Sheriff's stations in all of Los Angeles County. There are 88 cities within that huge area. We are fortunate to have Temple Station here for over 90 years. Our dedicated team has helped make Temple City one of the 50 safest cities in California.

Just some on the things on the horizon are: The City is in the process of having our newest park in over 60 years, Primrose Park, Street resurfacing and slurry seal on Rosemead Blvd, the last ground unit at Camellia Square has been leased to Planet Fitness, Moon Festival, Library expansion and redesign, Temple City Dodger Night, Las Tunas Drive redesign, CERT training, Halloween Carnival, Neighborhood Watch, Relay For Life, Classic Car Show and Fall Festival, Veterans Day remembrance, and Lights On Temple City.
