LAST TUESDAY

We welcomed Brian Le from the American Lung Association. He is the Advocacy Manager and is working closely with Temple City to control the e-cigarette epidemic. Brian began his talk with "Lifelong addiction often starts out sweet". The industry is infusing their product with sweet flavors. The flavors help mask the naturally harsh taste of tobacco, making flavored products more appealing to youth and easier to initiate and sustain tobacco use. The U.S. Surgeon General has declared e-cigarette use among youth an epidemic.



21% of all high school students in the U.S. report

using an e-cigarette product in the past 30 days. 40% of students who use vaporizers use them because they taste good. Only 10% use them in an attempt to quit smoking combustible cigarettes. Types of flavored products include e-cigarettes, vape pens, mods/tanks, pod mods, and liquid nicotine solution. The JUUL vaping products seem to have the biggest share and market their products not to adults who want to quit smoking, but rather to kids. They are marketing cheaper and smaller pack size to make it financially attractive to our youth.

82% of current e-cigarette users have used a flavored e-cigarette. 74% of current cigar users have used a flavored cigar. 79% of current hookah users have used a flavored hookah. How can kids be protected from flavored tobacco? Tobacco retail licensing can prohibit the sale of flavored tobacco. Establish minimum cost and pack sizes for tobacco products. Restrict sales near youth sensitive areas such as schools and parks.

On a personal note as a former smoker: When I quit smoking 49 years ago there was no such things as e-cigarettes and vaping. I was a three-pack-a-day smoker when I quit. I quit because cigarettes killed my father and mother, along with my two sisters. My father died at 63 from emphysema and heat disease. When I quit cigarettes were 25 cents a pack. I think it is about \$6.50 a pack now. I have never had a desire to go back to smoking, in fact, cigarette smoke really offends me. Have you ever walked by someone and they smelled like an ashtray?

It was good to have Kathy Perini with us today. We also welcomed Ron Dorazio and Mike Lepore. Ron Robertson's back procedure went well and is up and around. Dawn Tarin reported \$508 in sales for our last concert in the park.
