April was married to Don Lamie for eighteen years. They have three beautiful children. Don was a proud member of our U.S. Armed Forces, serving our country for 16 years in the Air Force. Don passed away at 38 years of age on March 7, 2015. He suffered from PTSD.

April now a widow with three children becomes involved with the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS). It is a program that supports families that have lost a military loved one. After the loss of her husband in 1994, founder Bonnie Carol realized that she was now a widow. After looking for support for her family, and other widows, she discovered that what she was looking for didn't exist. With her drive, passion, and military experience as an Army Officer and military spouse, she created TAPS. The assistance organization she created out of need has assisted more than 85,000 families, casualty officers, and caregivers.

The goal at TAPS International is to share best practices in peer based emotional support programs; to bring the surviving families of coalition partners who served together and died together into an international network of support; to strengthen an understanding between cultures of coalition partners that grief is universal; and to give surviving families a voice in creating stable societies, thereby continuing the mission their loved one died for. From organizing annual global working group gatherings, leading hope & healing expeditions to communities experiencing traumatic loss, localizing opportunities for meaningful employment of widows, and creating new content that speaks to the universality of the grief experience, TAPS convenes the world's citizens within the shared values of family and community.
