You might remember a few floats catching on fire. Part of the testing process requires everyone, including the driver to get off the float within 45 seconds.

The theme if the parade is "The Power of Hope". The theme of our Kiwanis float is "Soaring With Hope". In one of the largest youth service projects over 5,000 Key Clubbers help build 12 floats including out own. This is a big project for Cal-NeV-Ha because you need to feed these hungry workers lunch and dinner.

Over 1 million see the parade live on Colorado Blvd with another 450 million watching from around the world. Over 70,000 visit the post parade on Sierra Madre Villa. Kiwanis International gives \$60,000 a year towards the costs which will end in three years. Cal-NeV-Ha has to raise another \$100,000 to make it happen. The floats previously were built at the Rosemont Pavilion near the Rose Bowl. They are now decorated at Phoenix Decorating in Irwindale.
