Dan Snell has been a resident of Temple City since 1954. Longer than Temple City has been incorporated. A native of Maine, Dan used to be an avid gardener and often boasted of his giant zucchinis and beautiful rose bushes. He used to take 2 mile walks every morning to keep in shape. On his 90th birthday Dan went skydiving and jumped out of a plane at 10,000 feet.

Dan served his country as a Lt. in the Army and is an honored Veteran of WW II and was a member of China, Burma, and India Veterans. In 1957, Dan was Cub Master of Cub Scout Pack 157 at Cloverly School. He had the reputation of being a kind and motivational leader. He continued to be involved in activities mentoring young





scouts and was instrumental in organizing the first father and son Pinewood Derby.

Dan received a degree in chemical engineering from the University of Maine, and a week later he was in the army. He graduated from the Chemical Warfare Office Candidates School in October 1943 with a commission as a second lieutenant. Eventually Dan became a member of the OSS (Office of Strategic Services), a forerunner of the CIA. He was sent overseas and trained Japanese separatists. Dan was discharged in 1946. He and his wife June moved to Temple City in 1955 with two of their children, MaryJo and Dan Jr.. After retiring from Continental Can Corporation, he became a realtor and broker in Temple City. His office was located on the corner of Woodruff and Temple City Blvd. His honesty, integrity, and hard work kept his one-man office open for more than 30 years.
