THIS TUESDAY

Our featured speaker for the day will be Irene Turtle. She is a life coach and will help us to Use Our Unique Talents. Maybe she will delve into the talents that we should not use.

LAST TUESDAY

We deeply appreciate our program traveling from Chowchilla to be with us today. Our program for the day was Jaxon Powell. He is a 16-year-old sophomore. He has Neurofibromatosis Type 1 which has caused a tumor on his optic chiasm. The tumor has taken most of his vision and required a decade of medical intervention.

In the battle of tumor vs. Jaxon, Jaxon is winning. Like many children with NF, Jaxon needed speechtherapy. Now, being in front of a crown to speak, or to sing Country Western, is one of his favorite things to do.

His mother, Maria Powell is the mother of five children and a librarian to 500 1st and 2nd graders. She loves the printed word and was drawn to NF advocacy when her fourth child, Jaxon, was diagnosed with NF1. She has now become an advocate to help others with properly dianosing this tumor.

Neurofibromatosis (NF) is a group of three conditions in which tumors grow in the nervous system. The three types are neurofibromatosis type 1 (NF1), neurofibromatosis type 2 (NF2), and schwannomatosis. In NF1, symptoms include light brown spots on the skin, freckles in the armpit and groin, small bumps within nerves, and scoliosis. In NF2 there may be hearing loss, cataracts at a young age, balance problems, flesh colored skin flaps, and muscle wasting. The tumors are generally non-cancerous.

The cause is a genetic mutation in certain genes. In half of cases these are inherited from a person's parents while in the rest, they occur during early development. The tumors involve supporting cells in the nervous system rather than the neurons. In NF1 the tumors are neurofibromas (tumors of the peripheral nerves).

There is no known prevention or cure. Surgery may be done to remove tumors that are causing problems or have become cancerous. Radiation and chemotherapy may also be used if cancer occurs. In the United States, about 1 in 3,500 people have NF1. Males and females are affected equally frequently. In NF1, symptoms are often present at birth and otherwise develop before 10 years of age. While the condition typically worsens with time, most people with NF1 have a normal life expectancy.
