## THIS TUESDAY

Michelle Freridge is the Executive Director of the Asian Youth Center of San Gabriel Valley. She will speak about helping at-risk youth. Last year, AYC served 2,574 individuals with direct services. Eighty-eight percent (88%) of people served lived in low-income households.

## LAST TUESDAY

Roger Lockie was our featured program for the day. He brought his wife Barbara and their friend Mr. Curry. Roger began his talk reflecting on his days as President in 1987 when he attended the International Convention and voted to allow women in the club. We have been better for it ever since.

Roger took us through all the trials of producing large musical productions. In his 19-year career he has produced 102 musicals. Dolly Parton turned him down at \$80,000 plus food, hotel, first class air fare, and transportation. She said that if she did the show for 80M then the word would get out and she would not ever be able to fetch 100M.

Anytime an actor leaves the ground (stage) they receive hazard pay. Musicians are part of the union and receive \$154 per hour with a 3 hour minimum. If they happen to play more than one instrument they make out pretty good. The conductor gets twice that amount. There is also cartage pay for the person with a large instrument such as a harp or a bass. Of course they can carry their own instruments. Actors are not that much in demand with 42,000 in the union ready to be called.

Roger has become the interim Worship Pastor at Temple City First Baptist Church with the untimely passing of Matt Cooper.
