There were only 8 of us in attendance. Mike McVey is recovering from orthoscopic knee surgery. Ron Dorazio is having another birthday on August 10. Matt and Janet Smith have celebrated number 36 on August 1st. Our old soft serve (really soft) was sold for \$500 AS IS.

The purpose of our meeting was to discuss the future of our annual barbeque. It was agreed we were short handed with the absence of our Key Club. Everyone agreed also that everyone was extremely tired. It was agreed that we don't want to give it up after 49 years. We want to make it to number 50, but things needed to change including the menu. A possible good proposal to be further drawn out is having our meal catered with a vendor such as Jake's Roadhouse Barbeque. The meal would probably be a break even, our profit would be from our raffle and prizes. Preliminary net profit from the Barbeque is projected at about \$4,000, about the same as last year.

On August 1 we took a field trip to the Athens Services Material Recovery Facility in Sun Valley. Member Ed Chen was our host for the day including the bus we traveled in. Members making the trip including County and State representatives were Dan Snell, Ed Chen, Jerry Jambazian, Bob and Carole Rodenbucher, Helen and Larry Marston, Cindy Vance, Dawn Tarin, Ron Dorazio, Frank Reudel, Fern Vizcarra, Matt Smith, and Jim Robuck.

Athens CEO, Gary Clifford was on hand to greet us with a warm welcome. He began his talk by saying "We come to work each day with the purpose of recycling everything and not visiting a landfill." They recycle about 85% now with a goal of 100% by the year 2025.

The facility will have recycling processing capacity of 2 million tons per year of municipal solid waste (MSW), continuing its commitment to building the largest municipal solid waste management infrastructure in the greater Los Angeles area. Athens' growth in the region is testament to the city's commitment to achieve zero waste, they don't own any landfills. Their focus has always been exclusively on responsible waste collection and investing in the newest technologies to recover as much material as possible for other uses."

The Sun Valley MRF represents a \$50 million investment by Athens and features state-of-the-art equipment, all manufacured in Oregon, including advanced optical sorting and diversion technologies, which allows the company to divert as much material as possible from area landfills. The facility, which will accept 1,500 tons of waste per day.
