Reiner Roeske will present "How To Thrive, Not Just Survive".

LAST TUESDAY

Our speaker for the day was Deputy Bill Harrington. Bill is a 29 year veteran of LASD, having served in Temple City for 23 years. He does not let the 40 hour work week stop him from serving us. He was presented with the Vehicle Theft Recovery Award presented by the California Highway Patrol. He was selected twice as Temple City's Deputy of the Year in 1997 and 2012. His current duties include coordinating the Patrol Reserves, Mounted Posse, Youth Explorers, Volunteers, as well as Search & Rescue.

Bill is in charge of all the volunteers at Temple Station, including the 22 Reserve Deputies. They have regular jobs during the day but volunteer 2-3 days a week. Our own Ed Chen is a Level 1 Reserve Deputy who volunteers countless hours each week supplementing the duties of the patrol deputies. Of the three levels of reserves, Ed has reached the highest level. He is often called out because of his Mandarin language skills.

Bill also coordinates LASD Search and Rescue in our area, handling over 100 calls a year for folks who get in trouble in our foothills. He has been to 10 counties in California helping in search efforts. Please keep in mind that all members of Search and Rescue serve as volunteers including their horses. Bill is in charge of the Posse that can be called at any time. They patrol parks and can be seen leading in parades.

Bill's real love I think are the Explorers. Bill likes to recruit his young people in the 9th grade. They can serve between the ages of 14-20. They go through a 16-week academy. About 15-20% go on in their life's calling of being a deputy. There are over 200 volunteers at Temple Station that supplement the deputies. Volunteers participate at the front desk, Ham Watch, Volunteers on Patrol, and the 5 members of the clergy who help at difficult times.

Bill also oversees Vital Intervention and Directional Alternatives (VIDA). It is a structured 16-week program for non-violent, at-risk youth between the ages of 11 and 17½. Through collaboration between the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, community-based organizations, volunteers, schools and families, the program teaches youth the value of effective decision-making and taking responsibility for their futures.

We received a thank you from Superintendent Kathy Perini and CBO Marianne Sarrail for our donation of the portable projection screen that will be used throughout the District.
